

Sirindhorn International Institute of Technology (SIIT) Institute Announcement of Criteria for Satisfying the English Language Requirements of Doctoral Degree Students 2021 (B.E. 2564)

It is deemed appropriate to announce the criteria for passing the English requirements of doctoral students at SIIT. By and with the authority according to Section 13 of the Thammasat University Regulations on the Management of Sirindhorn International Institute of Technology, 2019 (B.E. 2562), the director of SIIT hereby lists the criteria for satisfying the English language requirements of doctoral degree students 2021 (B.E. 2564) as follows:

- 1. This announcement is called "SIIT Institute Announcement of Criteria for Satisfying the English Language Requirements of Doctoral Degree Students 2021 (B.E. 2564)".
- 2. This announcement is effective for doctoral degree students, enrolled from the academic year 2021 (B.E. 2564), onwards.
- 3. A student who has obtained one of the following scores is given P status (Pass) for the foreign language requirements in the doctoral degree curriculum under Section 48 of the Thammasat University Regulations on Graduate Studies 2018 (B.E. 2561).

(1) IELTS score of not less than 6.5

(2) Institutional TOEFL score of not less than 550

- (3) TOEFL (Internet-Based Test-IBT) of not less than 79, or TOEFL (Internet-Based Test-IBT) Home Edition of not less than 79, or TOEFL (Paper-Based Test-PBT) of not less than 550
- (4) TU-GET (Paper-Based Test-PBT) of not less than 550, or TU-GET (Computer-Based Test-CBT) of not less than 79
- 4. The curriculum committee may also waive a doctoral degree student from taking the above tests under the following conditions:
 - (1) The student is a native English speaker from the following countries: Australia, Canada, New Zealand, United Kingdom, or USA. The student passes an interview by an SIIT interviewing committee consisting of 3 native English speaking instructors.
 - (2) The student has already achieved one of the above scores (in 3.) before the start of the student's first academic semester. This score must not be older than 2 years from the test date to the start of the academic semester prior to the student's first academic semester and must not be older than 2 years from the test date to the student's entrance examination date.

With this exemption, the student's English Proficiency Requirement status is P (Pass) from the first semester.
